Maintenance Supervisor

FLSA Status: Exempt

BRIEF DESCRIPTION:

Under general supervision of the Water System Manager, performs responsible technical and skilled lead work in the maintenance of a water plant and related facilities; performs responsible supervisory duties and coordinating schedules of subordinate personnel; assists Water System Manager with planning and oversight of daily maintenance activities; performs related work as required. This position is available 24hours per day, 7 days a week, 365 days per year and is actively engaged in always maintaining regulatory compliance.

ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS:

Responsible for all aspects of maintaining the water treatment plant and related facilities. Coordinates/organizes/supervises maintenance and groundskeeping staff and tracks their utilization; plans, manages workload/implementation of maintenance work/activities using a computerized maintenance system, including the prioritization and scheduling of work in coordination with the Water System Manager. Responsible for the distribution/assignment of work, monitoring/tracking status and progress of work, making any necessary corrective actions and exercising QA/QC controls throughout the performance of work. Works with the Water System Manager on the procurement of maintenance equipment and makes decisions concerning outsourcing/contracting of maintenance work; establishes relationships and communication with outside sales venders and equipment representatives to find replacement equipment for PTRWA systems; coordinates with manufacture representatives to preform maintenance and repairs not performed by PTRWA staff. Oversee and mentor maintenance personnel on professional development and training; coordinate and/or provide safety training to prevent, detect, and correct unsafe conditions. Responsible for managing the application of pesticides on all PTRWA grounds and works in coordination with the PTRWA Parks and Recreation Manager/Chief of Police to ensure successful management of aquatic weeds in the reservoir. Facilitates the management of utility line locates on behalf of PTRWA and serves as the principal contact for PTRWA with the North Carolina 811 center. Will facilitate GIS tracking and monitoring of PTRWA facilities and will work in coordination with the PTRWA Parks and Recreation Manager on required GIS locates in the PTRWA buffer. Is responsible for the oversite of the maintenance on the PTRWA fleet of vehicles and will work with the Water System Manager, Operations Supervisor and Laboratory Supervisor to ensure that vehicles are being maintained by assigned personnel. In emergent situations may be called on to serve as the operator for the PTRWA water plant and could be required to be on-site for extended periods in response to emergencies and extreme weather. Will prepare and administer annual merit evaluations for subordinate employees; responsible for administering disciplinary reports; assists with project management, purchase order procurement/reconciliation and general oversight of maintenance budget; performs other duties as required.
